## ADDENDUM E – EAST AREA

## **RACE AREA, COURSES & MARKS**

### E1. The Race Area


The race area will be the Solent, to the east of the Lymington River

## E2. Courses

E2.1. One of the following courses will be sailed:

Red Course - signalled by the display of a Red Flag on the committee vessel

- Green Course signalled by the display of a Green Flag on the committee vessel
- E2.2. Classes will sail a course length Alpha or Bravo as published on the Official Notice Board and the number of laps according to a board displayed on the committee vessel before the preparatory signal for that class.
- E2.3. The course configuration and the order of rounding of marks for each course will be as follows:

E2.4. Course diagrams are not to scale. The actual course shape may be modified because of tide.

E2.5. [DP] Boats on the leg of the course from Mark 2 or 2A to Mark 3 must not cross the finishing line/gate. The finishing line/gate is an Obstruction for these boats.

# E3. Starting Line

- E3.1. The starting line will be between the course side of inner and outer starting marks.
- E3.2. The inner limit mark, if laid, is a starting mark, and shall have the same required side as the committee vessel.
- E3.3. Before a boat's first start of each day she shall pass the committee vessel so that her sail number is clearly visible to the race committee.

#### E3.4. The starting line marks will be:

Inner Mark	Inner Limit Mark (if laid)	Outer Mark
Staff with orange flag on committee vessel	Small pink buoy	Orange buoy with black & white chequered band OR Staff with orange flag on RIB

### E4. Marks of the Course

### E4.1. Description of Marks

Name / Number	Description of Mark:
Mark 1A	Very large orange dumpy buoy
Mark 2A	Orange dumpy buoy with blue band
Mark 1	Orange dumpy buoy
Mark 2	Orange dumpy buoy with black band
Mark 3	Orange dumpy buoy

E4.2. On the East Area only, boats may touch a mark other than a starting or finishing mark. A boat shall not manhandle a mark when it results in an advantage. This changes RRS 31.

### E5. Finishing Line / Gate

- E5.1. The finishing line will be between the course side of the inner and outer finishing marks.
- E5.2. The finishing line forms a gate which boats must pass through at the end of each lap.
- E5.3. The finishing line marks will be:

Inner Mark	Outer Mark
Staff with blue flag on the	Orange or white buoy with a staff
committee vessel	displaying a blue flag
